"The budget is carefully crafted based on budget revenue estimates provided throughout the year by the NM Department of Tax and Revenue, the NM Department of Finance and Administration, and the Legislative Finance Committee. The recent influx of federal dollars and the rise in oil and gas revenue means New Mexico will be flush with an historic amount of funding and out state's budget committee members will have an extremely important job ahead of them."
